II. Presentation Farmer Stress and Suicide Willow Lake, MPH, MA, REHS/RS, RN CT Department of Agriculture	Willow Lake presented on the unique stressors affecting farmers. Across the country there is an increased rate of suicide within agriculture. Increased stressors specific to the agricultural community include an aging workforce, isolated work environment, high injury rate, increased regulatory requirements, lack of health insurance, financial loss and being disconnected from technology. OSHA resources are not available unless it is a commercial farm. Agriculture in Connecticut is diverse, including seafood, dairy, beef, pigs, produce, orchards, flowers and producers of animal feed. A coalition consisting of the CT Department of Agriculture Farm Bureau, UConn Extension and Farm Credit East work closely together. They have tried to apply for grant funding but have been unsuccessful because the state is small and a land grant university is needed as a sponsor; USDA wants all of New England to work together.
