Cordier, Ph.D. American Center for CBT New England Center for I-CBT NECBT.com necbt@necbt.com	<ul> <li>Thomas Cordier, Ph.D., provided the following overview for his presentation: what is CBT?, the differences between I-CBT and traditional CBT, and how I-CBT works.</li> <li>Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) is an umbrella term based on The Cognitive Theory (Beck) that thoughts create our emotions and we behave accordingly. The Cognitive-Affective Model (CAM) is a newer model that correlates with the I-CBT system; it's based on the diathesis stress model and the belief is that emotions and thoughts coincide together to determine behavioral outcomes.</li> <li>Interpersonal-Cognitive Behavioral Treatment (I-CBT) is neurologically based upon how the brain works and is a working model that is always changing and growing. 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	<ul> <li>Intervention-Postvention Response <ul> <li>Intentionally looking at the protocol for postvention – what is working, what needs improvement, what is the follow-up, how we can engage all of the stakeholders and be a resource after a death by suicide; perhaps create a white paper for the initial response to a death by suicide</li> <li>Discussing how communities don't know what they don't know – want to bridge the gap and assist communities in the realm of prevention and postvention</li> <li>CTSAB members were encouraged to review postvention and other best practices on www.preventsuicidect.org</li> <li>Improving school/community relationships so the school doesn't need to feel alone in addressing the postvention process</li> <li>Annual refresher course for CIT trained law enforcement officers and first responders will include postvention and resources for communities and officers themselves</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Lethal Means <ul> <li>Final revisions of the card that will be included with the distribution of the medication lock bags; suggestion was made to make a magnet out of the card</li> <li>Materials being developed that integrate the Change the Script Campaign and One Word One Life campaign</li> <li>In the process of formalizing a letter to be signed by the CTSAB and DOT to be sent to the communities where the six bridge signs will be posted</li> <li>Continued work with Metro North Pilot Program to actively train their conductors and station personnel in QPR</li> <li>Additional Talk Save Lives: Firearms and Suicide Prevention trainings to be planned</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

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	<ul> <li>graduate programs at universities, different professional associations (NASW, APA, etc.)</li> <li>Trying to engage primary care, pediatrics, etc., before finalizing the curriculum</li> <li>March 22 at CCSU, Assessing and Managing Suicide Risk training for licensed health care professionals – more information to come on Listserv; 15 seats remaining</li> <li>Legislative/Budget         <ul> <li>Look at cga.ct.gov to see bills proposed and check for when their public hearings are scheduled</li> <li>Suicide prevention bill trying to change the Sandy Hook Law where currently anyone who voluntarily admits themselves for inpatient hospitalization for mental health would automatically go on the state police directory and not be able to have a permit to carry a weapon for 6 months. By asking for help, law enforcement officers lose their capacity to carry a weapon, which is a deterrant since they need to carry their service weapon 24/7 and may lose their job.
