PresentationsMashantucket Pequot Skeehch Wuyeekan: Good Medicine Project, Native Connections GrantMichele Scott, Eastern 	Michele Scott presented on the Good Medicine Project, a 5 year project (2016-2020) to address suicide in youth that incorporates culture and traditions into services. There has been a reported 600% increase in documented suicide attempts by tribal youth in the past 5 years. Isolation is a major risk factor for these youth. The grant-funded program has multiple objectives including a community needs assessment, the creation of a strategic plan, development of policies and procedures to promote coordination of care, integration of suicide and substance abuse prevention into programming and schools and hosting community events.
