Presentation Garrett Lee Smith Youth Suicide Prevention Grant Outcomes 2015- 2020 Sara Wakai, Ph.D. UConn Health	Dr. Sara Wakai is an assistant professor and Associate Director for the Center of Population Health at UConn Health. For over 25 years, she has conducted research and program evaluation related to suicide prevention, mental health, public health, substance misuse, correctional mental health and education. She has been the PI for the evaluation of several Garrett Lee Smith grants funded by SAMHSA to develop and enhance suicide prevention and mental health promotion programs in communities and statewide. Additionally, Dr. Wakai is contracted by CT DPH to conduct research on intentional, undetermined and unintentional deaths of Connecticut residents using the CTVDRS, the Connecticut level data of the National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS), and the CDC-funded Comprehensive Suicide Prevention in CT grant (2020-2025). She is a co-investigator on a study using transfer learning approaches to identify the clinical and demographic characteristics associated with elevated risk of suicidal behavior among prescription opioid users funded by NIH. She has been a lead evaluator in the development of the Connecticut Suicide Prevention Plans 2020 and 2025.
