	 CDC Comprehensive Suicide Prevention Grant As of 9/1/2021, in a new grant project year with most of the planning complete. Working on a communications project for mid-September and October broadcasting video PSAs for Suicide Prevention Month and through the Fall. Video links can be accessed here: <u>Suicide Prevention Videos for Youth & Adults CTSAB</u> (preventsuicidect.org) United Way contract expected to start October 1. United Way will be working with several local health departments throughout the state on suicide prevention initiatives within their jurisdictions, including the statewide suicide prevention awareness campaign: One Word, One Voice, One Life. In addition, they will connect local health departments with their Regional Suicide Advisory Board. Fine-tuning the suspected suicide ideation and suicide attempt case (SI/SA) definitions in the emergency department (ED) and urgent care center to be able to identify in a near-real time way people in crisis. Especially monitoring data for youth and young adults 10-24 years-old who are most likely to seek care at a hospital ED compared to other age groups. The definitions should be ready to move into the production database on 9/17/2021. Local health departments have access to the daily ED and urgent care center data in the database so they can monitor the rates of suicide-related ED and urgent care visits among residents in their area. 	

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	 Also working on a suspected acute mental health (AMH) case definition. SAMHSA Tribal Behavioral Health Grant Focus is substance misuse and suicide prevention among youth 14-24.
