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Presentation: 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline: Someone to Talk To Someone to Respond Somewhere to Go	The RSAB Lead, Mark D. Irons, shared this presentation which was provided by the 988 Implementation committee to the RSABs as well as other collaboratives across the state to provide information on 988 roll out nationally and in Connecticut. The soft roll out was emphasized with a July 2023 launch. The concept of no wrong door was highlighted. Talking points were provide to those in attendance.	
	Interest in the availability of text functionality was raised. Text as a phased 2 enhancement was discussed as well as the continued availability of the Crisis Text Line. Personal and professional experiences with CT's mobile crisis services were highlighted by attendees.	
Question & Comments	Interest in a training specific to suicide risk in the middle age population was expressed. Development of a language matters document was suggested which may address both suicide as well as mental health and could be disseminated across the region in a variety of settings.
