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	Interest in mental health Originally interested in why people turn to suicide and feel such despair Being exposed to stories made Cheryl curious about suicide Makes sure to feel gratitude because suicide can impact anyone Covering tragedies News outlets are dispatched to speak to victims during tragedies Cheryl has been dispatched to families after the 9/11 and Sandy Hook tragedies She ensured that when interacting with vulnerable families she was not just there for the story, but there to be a support Is Cheryl seeing a change in the way we report out on suicide? Language has changed around speaking about suicide Journalists are still learning what to watch for around language How can we best communicate/educate the media when we advocate for proper reporting. Best thing to do is to welcome journalists to meetings and encourage open communication with them How does Cheryl take care of herself when reporting on suicide and other subject? Make sure to practice gratitude and surround yourself with loved ones
