Officer Discretion vs Duty to Act	
riger@coventry-ct.gov	If an officer is acting "in good faith" in the exercise of honest judgment they are immune from liability.	

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	- Imminent harm exception ○ There has to be an identifiable person subject to imminent harm (imminent harm means a discrete place and time period at which the harm will occur). - Police Request Emergency Examination ○ Reasonable cause to believe that a person has psychiatric disabilities. ○ Dangerous to themselves or others ○ In need of immediate care and treatment - Where there is no identifiable subject to imminent harm, officer has the discretion to use other options (Mobile Crisis, other mental health professional referrals). Columbia Suicide Severity Rating Scale (C-SSRS) as a Triage Tool - Can be used as an evidence tool to determine if individual must go to hospital. Risk Protection Orders (RPO) - Great tool especially if firearms are involved in a call. - Can prevent someone from purchasing firearms or deadly weapons or seize a firearm/weapon that is already owned.	
	 Can be done if a person poses a risk of imminent personal injury to themselves or another person. Medical professionals can give an affidavit which requires law enforcement to become involved. 	
	Avoiding "Officer Created Jeopardy" - Safety priorities – must think of the law and the location where these scenarios are occurring to differing populations (i.e. public spaces, open air, vehicle, home, etc.). - Currently training police officers in these priorities to better respond to these scenarios. o Hostages • Officers have a duty to act to protect these people in whatever ways are necessary. o Innocents o Officers o Subjects	

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	Prohibitions on the use of deadly force - Deadly force may not be used against any person for the purpose of protecting property. - Deadly force may not be used against any person who poses a threat only to themselves. Suicide Ideation and Attempt (SI/SA) Publications - Includes Connecticut Suicidal Ideation and Self Harm Emergency Department Visit Report. - Includes Monthly CT Level Suspected Overdose and SI/SA Data - 3-Month Rolling average County Level Overdose Data Maps ○ Data is presented at the (a) County, (b) Local Health Dept., and (c) Regional Behavioral Health Action Organization (RBHAO) Level for SI/SA - Counts and Rates per 10,000 population. - Broken down by demographics: Race, ethnicity, gender, age-group. - Small numbers are suppressed. - LHDs and RBHAOs (for SI/SA) can see other jurisdictional aggregate data for comparison and situational awareness.
