Tieger pault@speedreadingpeople.com 860.604.9064 https://sensitivechild.org/	 The Tieger Personality Indicator for Children (TPI-CTM) is a new tool to help prevent suicide by enabling parents to quicky and accurately determine if their child may be at increased risk for anxiety or depression, know how to engage with them and get them help if needed Among the many risk factors for anxiety and depression in children, rigorous new research shows that a person's inborn personality type may be a powerful, underappreciated risk factor The TPI-CTM requires no training of parents and takes less than three minutes to complete; 93% accurate for children as young as 10 years old; helps parents understand their children at a deeper level and gauge potential risk for anxiety,
